THIS COURSE CAN HELP YOU:

1. APPLY FOR RBT CREDENTIAL

- a) Applicant must be at least 18 years of age and have completed high school or equivalent/higher.
- b) Complete 40-hours RBT Training which the passing of the PSY 2543 course will satisfy.
- c) After successful completion of the PSY 2543 course, complete the RBT Competency Assessment administered by a BACB certificant. This must be completed no longer than <u>90</u> days prior to applying to take the RBT exam.
- d) Must pass a criminal background check and abuse registry check.

2. TAKE THE RBT EXAM

Must take and pass the RBT exam. Authorization to take the exam is only provided to applicants who have submitted a complete exam application to the BACB, including all documentation necessary to demonstrate that they have met all of the criteria for RBT credential.
