Program Outcomes:

The program demonstrates evidence of achievement in meeting the end of program student learning outcomes:

1. Performance on licensure exam:

ELA: the most recent annual licensure examination pass rate will be at least 80% for all first-time test takers during the same 12-month period.

2. Program completion:

ELA: For IHL, 60% of the students entering the program will graduate within 150% length of their program options. For ACEN, 30% of the students entering the program will graduate within 100% length of their program.

3. Job Placement Rates:

ELA: 90% of licensed alumni will be employed in a healthcare facility within 6 months of graduation.

6. *Communication:* the graduate will interact effectively with patients, families, and members of the health care team to enhance patient satisfaction and health outcomes (MCM, 2011).

7. **Teamwork and Collaboration:** the graduate will function effectively within nursing and interdisciplinary teams while fostering open communication, mutual respect, and shared decision making (Adapted from QSEN, 2007).

8. Safety: the graduate will minimize risk of harm to patients and providers through both system effectiveness and individual performance (JCNPSG, 2017; QSEN, 2007).

9. Quality Improvement: the graduate uses data to monitor the outcomes of care processes (QSEN, 2007).

10. Evidence-Based Practice: the graduate will identify and use the best current evidence coupled with clinical expertise and consideration of patients' preferences, to make practice decisions (Adapted from QSEN, 2007).
