# Holmes Community College Associate Degree Nursing Program

## **Program Outcomes:**

The program demonstrates evidence of achievement in meeting the end of program student learning outcomes:

#### 1. Performance on licensure exam:

**ELA:** the most recent annual licensure examination pass rate will be at least 80% for all first-time test takers during the same 12-month period.

#### 2. Program completion:

**ELA**: 60% of students admitted to the associate degree nursing program will graduate within 150% of program length.

#### 3. Job Placement Rates:

**ELA:** 90% of licensed alumni will be employed in a healthcare facility within 6 months of graduation.

Upon completion of the Associate Degree Nursing Program of Holmes Community College the graduate will demonstrate competency in the ten essential competencies as outlined below:

- 1. **Patient-Centered Care:** utilizing the nursing process, the graduate will provide holistic, compassionate, coordinated, age and culturally appropriate, safe and effective care that recognizes an individual's preferences, values, and needs (Mississippi Competency Model {MCM}, 2011).
- **2.** *Professionalism:* the graduate will demonstrate accountability for the delivery of standard-based nursing care that is within the legal, ethical, and regulatory framework of nursing practice (MCM, 2011).
- **3. Leadership:** the graduate will demonstrate integration of leadership skills of critical thinking, communication, and facilitating change in meeting patient care needs (MCM, 2011).
- **4.** *Systems-Based Practice:* the graduate will demonstrate the ability to effectively call on available resources to provide care that is of optimal quality and value (MCM, 2011).
- **5.** *Informatics and Technology:* the graduate will use information and technology to communicate, manage knowledge, mitigate error, and support decision making (MCM, 2011)
- **6.** *Communication:* the graduate will interact effectively with patients, families, and members of the health care team to enhance patient satisfaction and health outcomes (MCM, 2011).
- 7. **Teamwork and Collaboration:** the graduate will function effectively within nursing and interdisciplinary teams while fostering open communication, mutual respect, and shared decision making (Adapted from QSEN, 2007).
- 8. *Safety:* the graduate will minimize risk of harm to patients and providers through both system effectiveness and individual performance (JCNPSG, 2017; QSEN, 2007).
- **9.** *Quality Improvement:* the graduate uses data to monitor the outcomes of care processes (QSEN, 2007).
- **10.** *Evidence-Based Practice:* the graduate will identify and use the best current evidence coupled with clinical expertise and consideration of patients' preferences, to make practice decisions (Adapted from QSEN, 2007).
